

On January 29, 1921, this office forwarded to you  
form letter showing that the arrival of Chaim Fishbain (1411  
North 25th St., Omaha, Neb.) could not be verified.

On the 15th instant this alien appeared at the Omaha  
office with letter authorizing his examination for the purpose of  
issuing certificate of arrival. Examination was accorded the  
alien and the record forwarded to the Inspector in Charge, St. Louis,  
Mo., who forwarded the record to this office through some misunder-  
standing instead of issuing certificate form 526a. The alien's  
declaration expired on the 21st instant and the above record reached  
this office too late to issue a certificate. Additional information  
contained in the record of hearing has enabled this office to find  
a record of the alien's admission at Port Huron, October 29, 1909,  
and certificate to this effect is enclosed herewith for such purpose  
as it may serve.

Notice to the Clerk of the Court:

This form is to be used only where an alien arrived in this country after June 29, 1906. When an alien desires to petition for naturalization, this form should be given to him before he is permitted to file his petition, and the execution of the petition for naturalization should not be commenced until the certificate of arrival is received by the clerk of the court. The alien should be directed to complete the letter below and carefully fill in all the blanks in this form, as the information is necessary to obtain the certificate of arrival, and will aid the clerk of the court in filling the petition for naturalization. The alien should then mail this form to the Commissioner of Naturalization, Department of Labor, Washington, D. C. That official will at once take steps to obtain and forward to the clerk of court the certificate of arrival required by section 4 of the act of June 29, 1906, to be attached to and made a part of the petition at the time of its filing. The statement of facts will also be forwarded to the clerk of the court. Notice will also be given to the alien that the certificate has been sent to the clerk of the court named by him.
